

Sad news to relay on the death of **Sally Bowe Daubel**, wife of former Associated Press Managing Editors (now Associated Press Media Editors) President **Jim Daubel**. She died Sunday at a Fremont, Ohio, care center following a long illness and one day after her 50th wedding anniversary. She was 72.

A frequent visitor to AP headquarters in New York City, Sally was no stranger to many in the Connecting family. Jim Daubel, then editor of The News-Messenger in Fremont, presided over the APME conference in 1986 in Cincinnati. He was instrumental in setting up the APME Foundation in 1988 to raise money to support educational projects for the advancement of newspaper journalism and served for many years on its board of directors. Sally often accompanied him on his trips to New York City for meetings and to conference venues.



"She passed peacefully after years of pain and frustration with a body she could no longer control," Jim Daubel wrote in an e-mail sharing news of her death with friends. "She was a great First Lady of APME and a very special person," said Bob Haiman, also a former APME president and chairman of an alumni group, the APME Regents. She is survived by three daughters and five grandchildren.


